Did you know that the Great Smoky Mountains National Park is the largest in the east of the USA? The park has over 1,000

kilometres of different trails. The yellow trails are for visitors who want to walk in the valleys. The green trails are for people who like to walk and climb a little. But tourists who want to climb the highest mountain in the park should choose the blue trail. It's the most difficult and visitors cannot go on it without guides.

As you know, many people come to this park to look at beautiful landscapes. Tourists also want to see many different plants and wild animals. You can meet here: deer, wolves, coyotes, and turkeys. But the park's biggest attraction are black bears. In the past people hunted many wild animals in this area. Now obviously nobody can do that because all animals are protected.
