Nagranie 1

William was born in 1840 in Virginia. His family were slaves, but later, they became free and moved to Massachusetts. At that time, Black Americans couldn't go to school. But William wanted to learn, so he studied in secret.

Why did he do that? You may ask. Well, William's biggest dream was to work in a church. But when the Civil War started, he changed his mind. He thought that the best way to serve God was by joining the army. And that's exactly what he did. In 1863, he became a soldier in a special group. This group was called the 54th Massachusetts Regiment. It was the first unit of Black American soldiers. They served in the North.

In July 1863, William and his group fought in a big battle at Fort Wagner in South Carolina. During the fight, the soldier who was carrying the American flag got injured. He couldn't carry it anymore. William was badly hurt too, but he took the flag and carried it up the hill. That's how he saved the flag.

After the battle, William was taken to hospital. When he was there, he got many letters. People wrote to him because they thought that he was very brave. Everyone was proud of him. That's why, after leaving the hospital, William was promoted to a higher rank.

Unfortunately, William had to leave the army because of his injuries. He went back to Massachusetts and worked at the post office. In 1900, he got the Medal of Honor, a special award for his bravery. William's story shows that anyone can be a hero.
